the history

David Chilcott lived at Nantwich, Cheshire with his parents and two sisters. All the family were Christians, and David was a lively and enthusiastic witness to his own very real personal experience of God. He shared his faith with his friends, taking some with him to the annual 'Whit Camp', a Christian holiday held for many years near Ross-on-Wye in Herefordshire.

In 1968, just three weeks after Camp, David was knocked off his bicycle outside his home and was killed. He was thirteen years old.

Knowing how much David had enjoyed and benefited from Camp, his parents and some of the Whit Camp Leaders decided to set up a Fund as a tribute to him, to enable other young people to attend Christian holidays. The Fund, a Registered Charity, was set up in 1969, and as a result many thousands of young people have had the opportunity of experiencing the fun, fellowship and teaching of Christian holidays.

the purpose

To assist young people to attend Christian holidays and conferences – young people who otherwise would be unable to attend without financial help.

the needs
